EXALT NO PERSON

I recently made some comments in class relative to the common practice among denominations and even among some of our brethren of elevating certain people above others. I thought the following article by Dan Murphy would be beneficial for all of us. We need reminding! (G.P.)

Human beings will sometimes idolize another person. In the New Testament times this happened to workers of God. The Lord sent Peter to preach salvation in Christ to Cornelius, his family, and friends, "...Cornelius met him and fell down at his feet and worshiped him. But Peter lifted him up, saying, 'Stand up; I myself am also a man'" (Acts 10:25-26). Peter wanted all men to know that he was not to be worshipped. Another occurrence was when Paul performed a miracle on a man who was crippled since birth. Those who witnessed it cried out, "The gods have come down to us in the likeness of men!" This exaltation was unacceptable, so Paul and Barnabas said, "Men, why are you doing these things? We are also men with the same nature as you, and preach to you that you should turn from these useless things to the living God..." (Acts 14:11,15) There is not one example in the Bible where messengers or workers allowed themselves to be lifted above others. When it was done by prideful or false teachers it was condemned.

God forbids the exalting of any person in any manner. Jesus rebuked the Pharisees and scribes because they loved prominent seats and desired special titles such as "Teacher" or "Father" when greeted in the market place. The Savior said, "You are all brethren" and only the Divine Father is worthy of the title "Teacher" or "Father" (Matt. 23:1-8). Paul also dealt with division among church members at Corinth. They sought to follow a favorite teacher over another saying, "I am of Paul" or "I am of Apollos" or "I am of Cephas" or "I am of Christ" (I Cor. 1:12). He reminded them, "Was Paul crucified for you?" or "Were you baptized in the name of Paul?" (I Cor.1:12-13). He identified himself and other teachers simply as "servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God" (I Cor. 4:1). He further downplayed any individual significance stating "Neither he who plants is anything, nor he who waters, but God who gives the increase" (I Cor. 3:7). Paul emphasized, "He who glories, let him glory in the Lord" and "Let no one boast in men" (I Cor.1:31; 3:21)

Jesus taught His disciples that greatness comes through being a humble and faithful servant (Matt. 23:11-12). Men may exalt those who are in highly visible positions and have acquired much knowledge, but leaders, teachers, and preachers are simply servants of God who do work benefitting others. We are never to lift a person with special clothing, prominent seating, or fine titles that designate them above all others. This is the not the Lord's way.
