HELPS IN HANDLING BEREAVEMENT

Death has knocked on our door repeatedly in the last few months. All of us have or will know the loss of a family member or close friend. I have watched many with great admiration as they have been able to endure the loss and also encourage others who have done the same. The following thoughts can be of help in dealing with grief:

Express your emotions: Jesus wept thus it should not be considered a Christian virtue to be unmoved by the loss of a loved one. The Bible does not say "sorrow not," but it says, "sorrow not, even as others which have no hope" (1 Thessalonians 4:13).

Seek the aid of your friends: When Paul neared Rome, the brethren came to meet him and he "thanked God, and took courage" (Acts 28:15).

Compel yourself to be with people: We all need some privacy but we also need time with other people (cf. 2 Samuel 12:19-23).

Express your feelings in words: Sometimes talking about what we are feeling helps to stabilize our life.

Avail yourself of spiritual resources: Turning to the Bible for words of comfort can help strengthen our faith. The power of prayer is always available to God's children.

Don't brood over what might have been: Remember Mary and Martha? "Lord, if thou hadst been here, my brother had not died" (Jno. 11:21,32).

Actively pursue worthwhile tasks: Once the initial shock has passed it is time to get busy. Reach to the things that are before us (Philippians 3:1).

Make careful, thoughtful decisions: Don't get in a hurry with major decisions for they may affect the rest of your life.

As fellow Christians we can help facilitate many of these things in the lives of those who are grieving. Again, our hearts go out to the many who have lost loved one. We are here if you need us. Please let us know. You don't have to suffer alone. (Major points by Hardeman Nichols) Gary Puryear
